 - **3** SECTION 1. SHORT TITLE.
 - 4 This Act may be cited as the "Loggers Economic As-
 - 5 sistance and Relief Act".

| 3 | (a) DEFINITIONS.—In this section: |
| 4 | (1) ELIGIBLE ENTITY.—The term "eligible enti- |
| 5 | ty" means any timber harvesting business or timber |
| 6 | hauling business that harvested or hauled unrefined |
| 7 | timber products in the previous calendar year. |
| 8 | (2) MAJOR DISASTER.—The term "major dis- |
| 9 | aster"— |
| 10 | (A) has the meaning given the term in sec- |
| 11 | tion $102(2)$ of the Robert T. Stafford Disaster |
| 12 | Relief and Emergency Assistance Act (42 |
| 13 | U.S.C. $5122(2)$; and |
| 14 | (B) includes an insect infestation declared |
| 15 | a major disaster pursuant to such Act. |
| 16 | (3) GROSS REVENUE.—The term "gross rev- |
| 17 | enue" means the gross revenue generated by an eli- |
| 18 | gible entity from timber harvesting or timber haul- |
| 19 | ing services within the normal range of operation of |
| 20 | the eligible entity, as determined by the Secretary. |
| 21 | (4) Secretary.—The term "Secretary" means |
| 22 | the Secretary of Agriculture, acting through the Ad- |
| 23 | ministrator of the Farm Service Agency. |
| 24 | (b) PAYMENTS.—The Secretary shall make payments |
| 25 | in accordance with this section to eligible entities that as |
| 26 | a result of a major disaster experienced a loss of not less |
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than 10 percent in gross revenue in 30-day period or quar ter of a calendar year, as compared to the gross revenue
 of the eligible entity during the same 30-day period or
 quarter of the previous calendar year.

5 (c) AMOUNT OF PAYMENT.—The amount of a pay6 ment made to an eligible entity under subsection (b) shall
7 be equal to 10 percent of the gross revenue of the eligible
8 entity during the applicable period under subsection (b).

9 (d) ALLOWABLE USE.—The Secretary shall only 10 make a payment under subsection (b) to an eligible entity 11 that certifies to the Secretary that the payment will be 12 used only for operating expenses.

(e) REPORT.—Not later than 180 days after the date
of enactment of this Act, and annually thereafter, the Secretary shall submit to the Committee on Agriculture of
the House of Representatives and the Committee on Agriculture, Nutrition, and Forestry of the Senate a report
describing the payments made under this section, including—

20 (1) the identity of each recipient of a payment;21 and

(2) the amount of each payment provided toeach recipient described in paragraph (1).

| 14 | (g) Authorization of Appropriations.—There is |
| 15 | authorized to be appropriated to carry out this section |
| 16 | \$50,000,000 for each of fiscal year 2024 and 2025. |
